## Stress, Written Accentuation, and Spelling

## **Natural Stress**

Words that end in a vowel (a, e, i, o, u) or the consonants n or s have their natural stress on the next to last syllable.

Words that end in any consonant other than  ${\bf n}$  or  ${\bf s}$  have their natural stress on the final syllable.
